In addition, one student is beginning a two-year course in auto mechanics training with our financial assistance.

<u>Agroforestry</u>

In spite of security issues, the nurseries in Vialet and Furcy continued to function as much as possible. Distribution to small scale farmers totalled over 45, 000 seedlings such as avocado, coffee, breadfruit, mango, oak, mahogany and tamarind.

Much was accomplished in 2021 in Humanitarian Aid. Essential items were provided to rural residents who lost most everything in the devastating August earthquake. Repairs were made to some homes and a school. Medical help and psychological support were provided to 2 sponsored children and 1 adult. Covid-19 masks were distributed in several areas. In response to food shortages, dry goods were distributed in Laboule 12. An oven provided to Les Messagers thanks to a donation by the late Rob Robertson, offered these youngsters an opportunity to learn simple recipes. Through a microloan initiative, a sponsoree's mom started a small business and has now begun reimbursing MDFH.
