Humanitarian Aid

A bereaved family received help with medical, funeral and psychology expenses following the death of a young sponsoree. A former sponsoree received funds for expenses related to her baby's arrival. The Bomplan Methodist Church received help to rebuild its roof. An elderly poor handicapped lady received funds for food and medication. In Savannah and Laboule 12, needy families received food. Two sponsorees taking care of their ill mother received help with medical care. A former sponsoree who fled gang violence received funds to purchase sheets to sleep on the ground in a safer location with a bed being provided later.

In December, 2,250 people in 9 locations benefitted from the Foundation's Christmas offering. In Savannah, Laboule 12 and Latibolière, families gratefully received dry good kits. Meals were served and toys distributed to children and support staff at École Presbytérale Saint Gérard de Beaudry and École Nationale de Corail. At École St Vincent de Paul, École Communale de Pétionville, École Rama de Duplan and Laboule 12, toys, snacks and toiletries were distributed. In Brigade, toys and gifts were handed out. All were thankful to the Foundation for bringing a smile and hope at Christmas.
